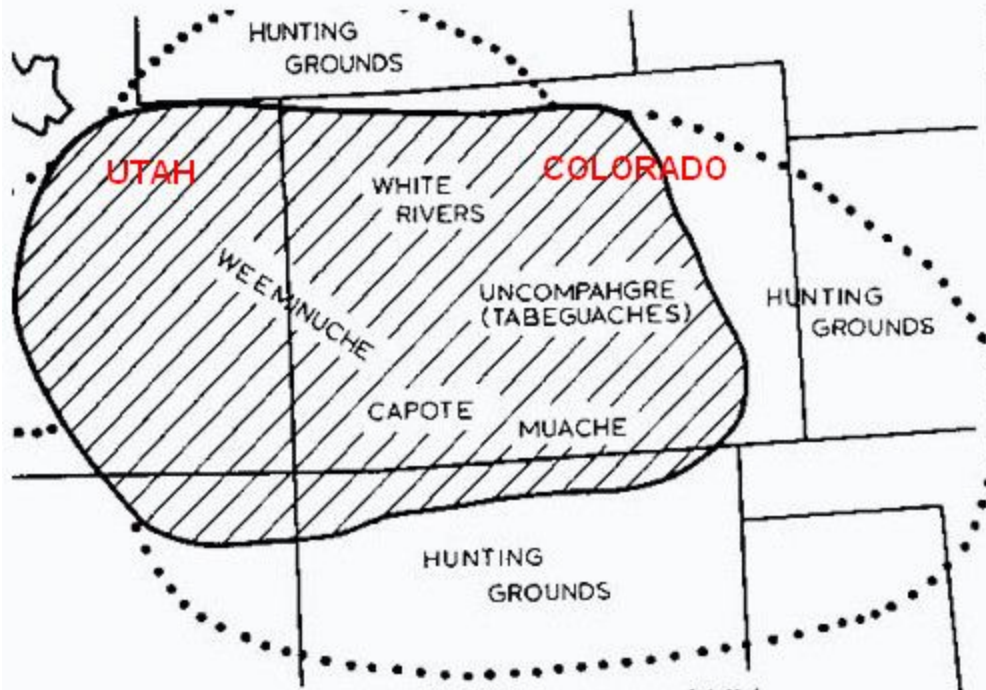




Pre 1879 History

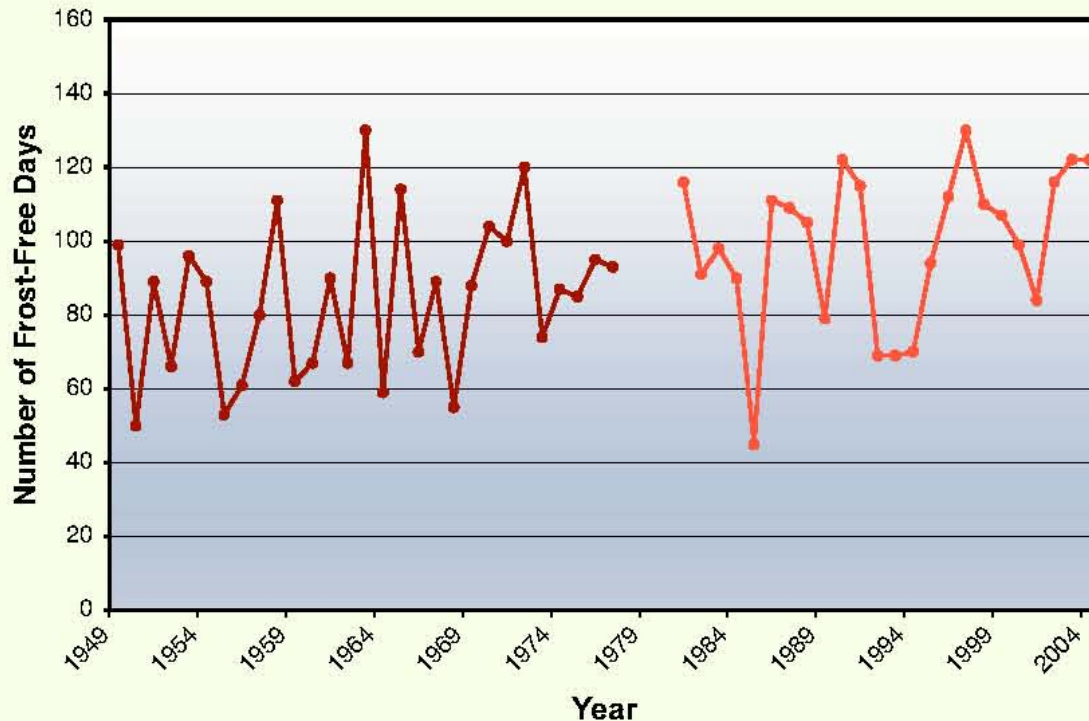






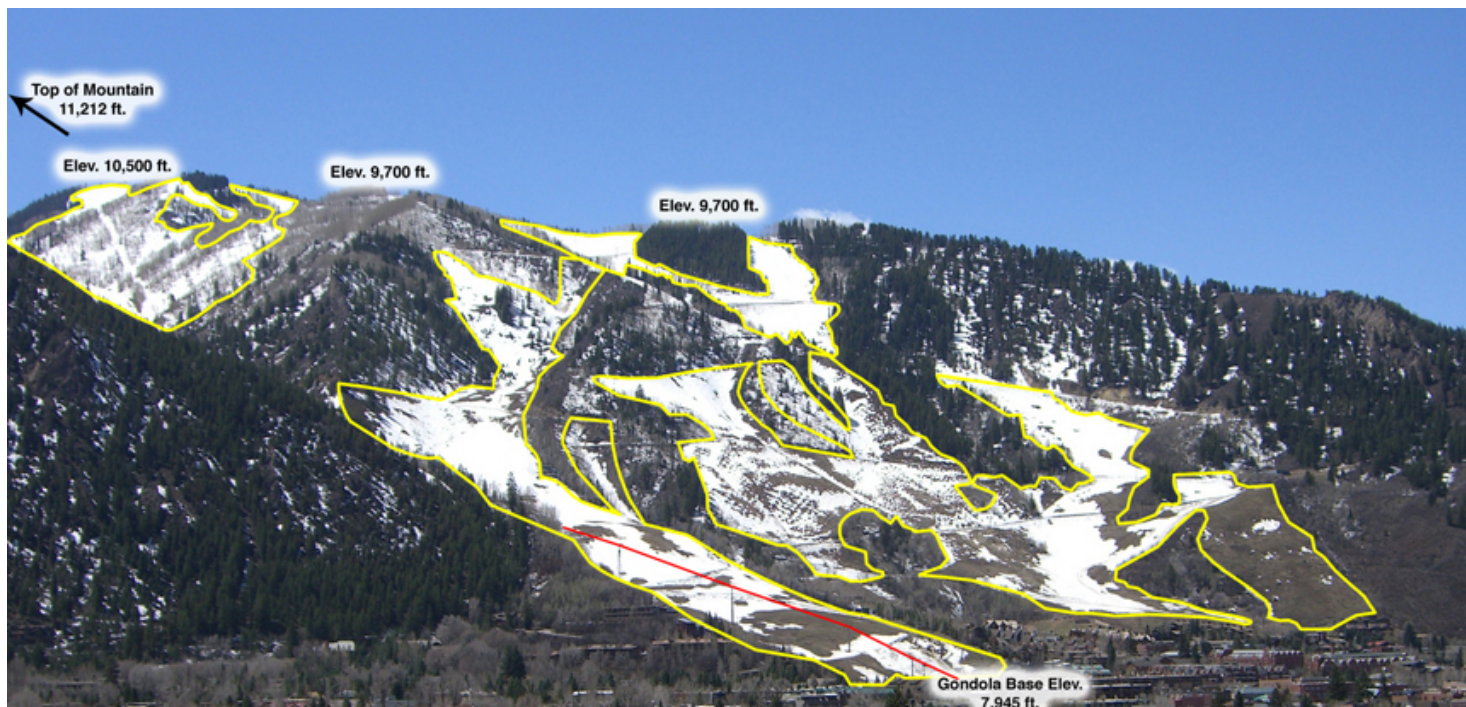

Frost-Free Days Per Year, Aspen CO



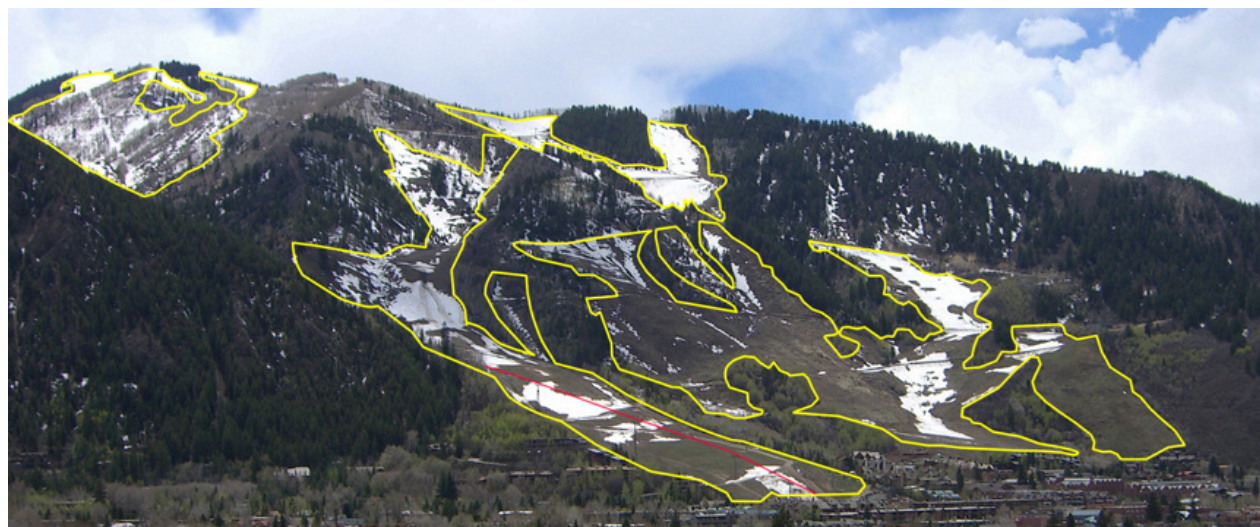

FIGURE ES.1: Frost-free days per year in Aspen as recorded at the Aspen National Weather Service Cooperative Network Station, 1949-2004. (Note: The Aspen weather station was moved in 1980 from an in-town elevation of approximately 7945 feet to 8163 feet at the Aspen Water Treatment Plant. Dark red represents data from the old Aspen station. Light red represents data from the current Aspen 1 SW station.)

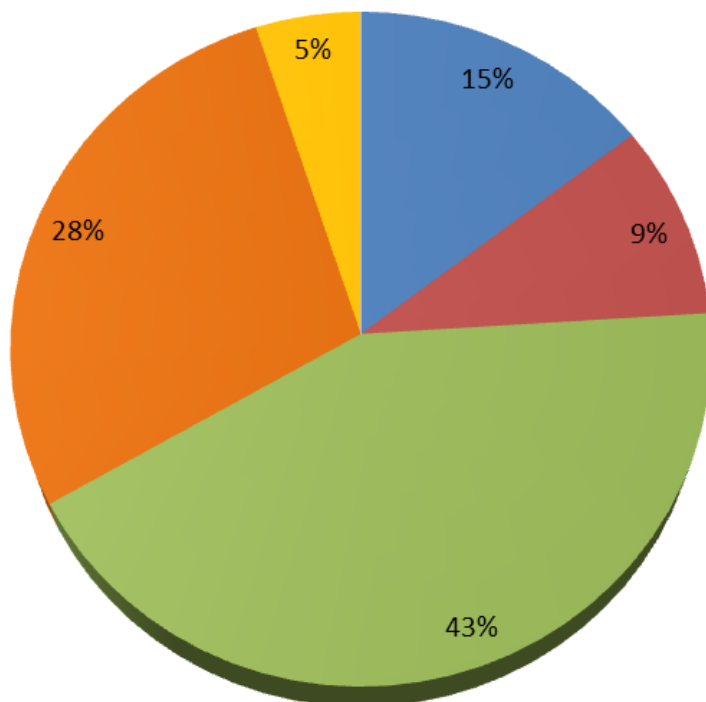

RFTA (Roaring Fork Transportation Authority)

2nd Largest public transit system in Colorado after Denver RTD

Believed to be the largest rural public transit system in the U.S.

1st Rural BRT System in the U.S.

2012 Information:

- 3.95 million passengers
- 3.68 million miles of service
- 250 employees during peak winter season
- 100 large transit vehicles
- \$23.9 million Operating budget/\$25.7 Million Capital
- 70-mile corridor
 - Aspen to Glenwood Springs
 - Glenwood Springs to Rifle
- 34-mile Rio Grande Rail Corridor and Trail

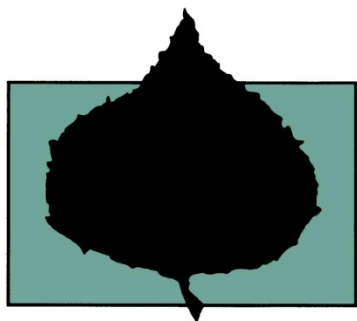
